Forklift Training Guidelines

It is essential that all workplaces using forklifts have the checklist below or one equivalent on the premises. If all of the safety regulations are being followed, each of these questions should be answered with a "yes". A "no" to whatever question indicates a procedural flaw that might result in damage to machine, accident or injury.

- 1) Is the forklift operating area separated from pedestrian traffic?
- 2) Is access by pedestrians to forklift areas restricted by a barrier?
- 3) Are pedestrian walkways well marked and provided?
- 4) Are "forklift in operation" signs clearly visible?
- 5) Are mirrors for pedestrians and drivers provided at blind spots?
- 6) Are changes to daily lift truck schedules communicated to all affected staff?
- 7) The lift truck tires being used are suitable for all operating surfaces?
- 8) Is the seatbelt being used?
- 9) The seat of the forklift is in good condition?
- 10) The maintenance schedule of the forklift is being followed?
- 11) Are yearly inspections of the forklift being done?
- 12) Is the forklift right for the needed job?
- 13) Is there a load chart that is readable on the forklift?
- 14) Could the operators read and understand the load chart?
- 15) Does the chart list the safe capacity for different uses and attachments?
- 16) Are the warning devices on the forklift working properly?
- 17) Is the operating speed control device fitted right?
- 18) The lift truck overhead cage is fitted right?
- 19) Do the operators of the lift truck have certifications to use the machine?
- 20) Are speed limits and warning signs being observed?
- 21) Are forklift operators up to date on training for all kinds of forklifts being operated?
- 22) Do operators know their duties to report any machine damage and forklift accidents?
- 23) Is the pre-test checklist reviewed each day prior to the machinery being used?
