The CDL would qualify somebody for some heavy machine jobs, although the majority of jobs would need extra qualifications. Like for instance, a crane operator will need to take an in-depth training course and must pass different certification exams to be able to become a crane operator, while truck drivers may only need some on the job training to go along with their CDL. The in-depth training which follows certain machinery is needed because much of the work happens in dangerous scenarios and dangerous scenes so the operator must be able to make sure of a safe working surroundings at all times. The safety training is vital as well as the communications training that helps the crew on the ground be able to communicate with the operator all the time.

Heavy equipment machines normally work in extreme settings and are put under great strain regularly. Therefore, there are numerous heavy equipment jobs available in maintenance and repair. Heavy machinery operators are very trained workers who can troubleshoot, repair and diagnose heavy machines on site or in a workshop. Mechanics should be ready to transport their tools to a job site and perform maintenance and repair in a variety of conditions.

Sometimes it may be possible for delivery drivers to operate machines with just a simple CDL. Then again, some jobs will need more specific training. Drivers that should handle big machinery or parts for construction projects would need the heavy machinery operator to complete further training. Usually, the drivers operate with chaperone vehicles which are driven by drivers who are trained. These chaperone vehicles typically escort the delivery truck to its destination.
